ORGANIZATION OF STUDENTS' INTERNATIONAL ACADEMIC and CREDIT MOBILITY



Academic mobility is the movement of students or research teachers for training or conducting research within a certain academic period: a semester or academic year – to another institution of higher and (or) postgraduate education (hereinafter referred to as OHPE) /within the country or abroad/ with mandatory transfer of completed educational curricula in the form of credits in their OHPE or to continue their studies in another OHPE.

International Credit mobility means the students' movement for a limited study or internship period abroad – within the framework of continuing education at their home institution of higher education – with the aim of accumulating academic credits (after the mobility phase, students return to their educational institution to complete their studies).

<u>Transcript</u> is a document containing a list of mastered disciplines and (or) modules, and other types of academic work for the corresponding period of study, indicating credits and grades.

To ensure academic mobility (international one included), students study particular disciplines at other universities, including abroad institutions.

In this case, a bilateral agreement is concluded between the universities.

In order to benefit from the diverse educational experience of other universities, "mobility windows" define the time frames, academic disciplines and credits' volumes that a student acquires at another higher education institution.

The procedure for both organizing academic mobility and selecting the Baishev University students is carried out on the basis of the Regulation on academic mobility of students, faculty and staff.

At the same time, the permission for participation in academic mobility within the framework of programs financed by the state is carried out in accordance with the Rules on sending for study abroad, including one within the academic mobility framework, approved by the Order of the Minister of Education and Science of the Republic of Kazakhstan dated November 19, 2008 No. 613.

To participate in international credit mobility, knowledge of a foreign language at the level required by the host educational institution is required.

The final document confirming the student's education under the mobility program is a transcript or its equivalent in the host country.

The transcript contains information about the training program: names of disciplines (modules), grades, number of academic credits gained.

The learning outcomes fully mastered by students within the academic mobility framework and confirmed by the transcript are re-credited by the domestic university without fail.
